



## **Overview**

The 330 Ambassadors are a select group of students from the Akron area chosen each year by the LeBron James Family Foundation to serve as role models and mentors to younger generations in the community, specifically through the I PROMISE School. Students in the Foundation's program are currently in grades 3-11. The Foundation is committed to creating and supporting events that demonstrate its dedication to the community and the 330 Ambassadors play an important role in making this happen. The Foundation seeks Ambassadors who embody LeBron's passion for education and service.

## **The Role of an Ambassador**

The 330 Ambassadors work alongside the Foundation throughout the entire year with an emphasis on involvement within the I PROMISE School. The primary purpose of the Ambassadors is to serve as an extension of LeBron as role models and mentors to children in the community. As 330 Ambassadors, you will collaborate as a team to operate The Embassy located in the I PROMISE School which serves students and families in the Foundation's program. Ambassadors will also represent LeBron through hands-on involvement with various events and initiatives put on by the Foundation.

For students at the I PROMISE School, one of their greatest needs is mentorship – people they can trust and relate to as they progress on their educational journeys. To that end, 330 Ambassadors will make a commitment to serving at IPS for a minimum of ten weeks during the school year (or ONE quarter). With consistency being critical for these students, the hands-on, one-on-one relationships the Ambassadors build with them are foundational to their success in school and in life.

The Foundation is excited for a group of motivated high school students to serve as part of the upcoming 2020-2021 class of 330 Ambassadors. These high school students must be currently enrolled within Akron Public Schools or St. Vincent-St. Mary High School with a minimum GPA of 3.0. Ambassadors are outgoing team-players who are passionate and dedicated leaders. The Ambassador's role is year-round; the group meets during the summer for team building/training and serves alongside the Foundation Team with special projects as well as work the Foundation is doing within the I PROMISE School. During the school year, Ambassadors have direct, intentional interactions with the Akron I Promise Network students through various community activities, the I PROMISE School and other opportunities.

### **Expectations**

All Ambassadors sign a commitment contract; if an Ambassador chooses to disregard the expectations set forth, he/she will be asked to step down from his/her position.
